In addition to the ink stamp and signature above, the following are other examples of acceptable methods of sealing an envelope.

Example: Dry seal from the issuing body

Documents must be submitted to the Foreign Pharmacy Graduate Examination Committee™ (FPGEC®) in a sealed envelope with a seal, stamp, or signature from the appropriate issuing body placed across the seal of the envelope so that it overlaps the flap closure and the body of the envelope. The above five examples are different methods the issuing body may use to seal the envelope.

\*Please note if only a signature is used to seal the envelope flap closure, the same signature must be present on the document inside of the envelope.
